The North Coast Division holds 10 meetings a year (none in July and August). Meetings are on the **2nd Friday of each** 





## **CONTEST TABLE**

Wood has been an important part of railroads from the very beginning. The wooden ties and even wooden rails with metal bands on top of the rails so trains had something to run on. Wood was used to build the cars, both freight and passenger. Wood has been and still is a major commodity that the railroads transport. The subject matter for the October Contest was loads from the wood industry. There were over a dozen entries in the contest with wood just out of the forest to the finished product represented as loads on rail cars. Winning entries in the models found a first time participant, Rick Tall, taking first place. Joe Kurilec took second place with his entry and Ken Orchard logged a third place win. Diorama entry winners were Joe Filipiak with a lumber mill scene. John Puch reached out from an island in the Atlantic to enter his work that came in second place. Thank you to everyone who entered an item in the contest and to all those who voted for their favorites.

The November Contest is a tip of the hat to the resourcefulness of the short line, backwoods railroads to meet a need. The railroads needed to move people and materials but neither were in great quantities. Their solution was to take half the seats out of a passenger car, build a dividing wall (out of wood) and use the open space to haul freight. These cars were referred to as combine cars. Bring in your version of a combine car, whether it's straight out of a box or kit bashed or even scratch built. Let's see what you've got. Remember, the dioramas are not mini layouts, they are simply a railcar in a small environment scene. Well, now that the cold winds and rain are upon us, we can find time to do something that's really fun, model railroading. Remember, a little model railroading a day keeps the doctor away, unless, of course, you are a doctor.

# **Fall Layout Tours**

#### **Bruce Bowie on East Broad Top......Under Construction -- HO**

My Work Crew(Gary Dunn, Chris Boyd, Jeff Gray, Fred Wagner, Steve Kelly) have provided skills and inspiration to get the EBT v3.2 well along the way. Mainline track is (80%) complete including handlaid curved, dual gauge and stub turnouts. Scenery is 70% complete and what is complete is amazing. I am using steel "2x4's" and polyiso foam for the main structure.

The layout is two level with a helix to travel between levels and includes several unique features. The peninsula uses "mushroom" construction to allow operations on both sides. The layout is designed for operations. It is a proto-freelanced design of the narrow gauge East Broad.

#### John Hemsath on Bay Lines II

The layout was open last October; four months into its construction. The benchwork, which is complete, is L-girder supported on brackets attached to the wall so there are no legs. Now 90% of the track is laid and most of the structures are on the layout. A few of the structures from the old layout in Bay Village have been reconstructed to fit their new space. Several new structures are on the layout as well. Scenery has begun as has track ballasting. Several operating sessions have been run so it's finally a working layout running on wireless NCE DCC.

The setting is an industrial Midwest area in September of 1946. For an operating session we'll use either all steam or early diesels.

Please park in the driveway or on the opposite side of the street. Enter through the front door.

#### Chuck Shick......Under Construction – HO

Entire layout work has been done by myself, with helpful comments from Ron Spiga, and some detail parts were provided by Joe Kurilec.

This is mostly a single track, single level layout and is completely freelanced. The layout is designed for Operations, and has only a little scenery done.

The Layout is DCC currently using NCE wired throttles.

The layout is in the basement and is not handicap accessible. There is a handrail for the steps. Parking in Driveway, or on same side of street. Enter through Side Door and go down stairs.

# Golden Spike Work Session

The Division held its first Golden Spike Work Session on Saturday, October 15th at the Strongsville Branch of the Cuyahoga County Public Library. We had 9 members attend. We spent the morning and afternoon working on detailed commercial rolling stock kits – building kits and sharing tips and techniques. Everyone enjoyed the session and agreed it was good to have a uninterrupted time for modeling.

#### **NEXT SESSION**

The next work session is tentatively scheduled for January 17, 2025, at the Strongsville Branch of the Cuyahoga Public Library. The Branch Meeting Rooms are excellent. The meeting rooms are fully equipment with drop down screen, LCD project, computer with internet access, audio system, tables, chairs and electrical outlets.

The January work session will be a hands-on weathering clinic. The clinic will show various weathering techniques from simple washes to use of oil and acrylic paints and use of weathering powders. Attendees are asked to bring 4-5 various pieces of rolling stock to work on and prototype photos of each type of rolling stock they bring. The photo does not need to match the road name and number of the model but should be similar and represent the look the member wants to achieve.

We're still working out the details of the supplies needed, but as with the previous work session, a list of supplies needed will be provided.

Again, this is a great opportunity to set aside some time to learn new skills (which is the mission of the NMRA), have dedicated modeling time and to get know your fellow Division 4 members a little better.

## What's On Your Workbench



Light Works USA by Miller Engineering Neon Sign Kit # 33-8935

Seeing the SWP paint sign on Chuck Klein's (D) layout inspired me to make this addition to my layout as it is in Cleveland, Ohio. The frame is etched metal and is easy to build using super glue. It runs on 3 AA batteries. There is a 3 way switch on the battery unit allowing for on/off/flashing. Once the sign is placed on a building, I will set the switch to the desired position (flashing). I will simply cut one of the battery power cables and run the cable to a switch (SPST) at a location on a control panel. I do not want to control the sign from the building.


