Our next meeting date is Friday, January 13th. Following our short business meeting there will be a clinic on making trees presented by several Division members. This is an opportunity to see several different methods for modeling trees for the layout. Whether you build a module or a layout, trees are an item that need to be replicated in quantity. Our modeling contest this month is non commercial trucks or cars. These too are items that modules or layouts require in quantity.

Congratulations go out to Denny Whitaker and Scott Benson for the awarding of the Dennis Novak Service Award. Both gentlemen contributed great time and effort for the Division and are given this award to recognize those contributions.

I would like to mention that our Module Group displayed and operated in Twinsburg Reserve Armory last month, for the benefit of our Reserve military and their families. Anything we can do to lift the spirits of those who protect us in a troubled world deserves mention. Thanks go out to Scott, our Module Group leader, and to Dave Williams who shot the photos in this issue of the Flatwheel.

Last month, I recounted how I went about developing the concept and planning for my Spruce Creek Railway (a wholly owned fictitious subsidiary of the B&O Railroad). The writings of John Armstrong highly influenced the design. Developing "Givens and Druthers" I came up with three areas for consideration: (1) Size attributes of the railroad. This is usually a political event between I want more and she wants less. I wish you good luck on this one. (2) Environmental attributes of the railroad. This includes consideration of how do I move the furnace or go around it, ductwork issues, hot water tank location, washer and dryer and things of that sort. (3) The railroad itself. This includes things like where is it geographically located, what does it do, what era does it operate, how do you want it to visually present it, your preference for continuous running or switching operation.

Next month I'll go into more detail on the three points previously mentioned. You will notice we still haven't started a track plan. Not to worry; getting to the point of being able to draw a track plan is a journey toward "plausible reality".

That's it for this month.... Remember, never trade steam for water.
