Contest Corner

Photo Contest Notes

As we head toward this year's Regional and National Conventions, I want to share a few tips I picked up during last year's Regional photo judging.

-Follow the presentation instructions to the letter.

Judging usually takes hours. The quickest way to separate losers from winners is by immediately eliminating incorrectly matted (or not matted) entries. No plastic or glass covers, and matting, not just glued to some cardboard. Never approach the photo contest as a casual event if you hope to win.

-Make a good print.

Check the print for things introduced by the camera, computer or printer, like lines, blank spots, and extra color dots. Use a magnifying glass. Never have a date stamp on the print!

-One sun on layouts.

This one came as a surpirse to me. Most layout articles show us photos with nice even lighting from multiple sources. Contest entries, however, should be set-up to look like they were taken outdoors - one light source simulating the sun (or possibly the moon). There are some variants, like street lighting and reflections - just avoid multiple bright sources.

-Real, but not too real for models.

One of last year's model entries had a telephone in front of an engine. Maybe the photographer was trying for a realistic shot but it didn't wash. You are expected to be able to control model placement.

-Pictures within pictures.

I didn't completely agree on this exercise, but be aware that judges may mentally crop your picture down further to see if you missed an even better picture. Also - and I do agree here - don't chop off parts of important elements (like locomotives). Don't let it look like an old Instamatic shot where the viewfinder always showed 8 feet left of the resulting picture.

-Black and White.

There's a lot more to creating a good B&W print than pushing some button in your photo software, little of which can be adequately covered here. Ask yourself why the picture is better in black and white than color. Good focus, interesting shapes, lines, and shadows are usually more noticiable in B/W than color.

Do not enter the same picture in both color and B/W versions - you haven't doubled your chances of winning since they'll both look worse in comparison to each other. The judges will think that you couldn't figure which one looked better and they won't bother much with either one.

These are a few of the most obvious issues. The competition of really good photographs is usually very intense and there's no set formula available for winning but hopefully I've helped you to avoid several of the less obvious mistakes. Don't be too upset if you don't get an award, at least you've got a good picture to take home.
