The clinic for the November meeting will be in two parts. Part one is a short presentation by Steve Kaplan/ David James on an aspect of the Achievement Program. Part two is a clinic presented by Bill Cramer entitled "Remembrance of the Chicago Division on the B&O". For those who have not heard any of Bill's presentations, you have missed a real treat. Bill will be one of the featured clinic speakers at the upcoming Cleveland National Convention.


