Model Railroading as a hobby is small in numbers. It enjoys products from manufacturers who are, in general, small in size. If you look at the number of products available in the marketplace, it is amazing so many products are commercially available. The reason is because of so many dedicated modelers who decide that they would like to put their ideas into production and offer the product to the modeler market. Remember, that many of these people have a day job. The modeling production is their spare time job and it is driven by passion. The NMRA National organization helps blend all those manufacturers together to provide the modeler with a consistent product (wheel /flange shape are examples) that allow the modeler to run his car on any track in the country. And it bears note that the National organization is also comprised of people who share the same passion and volunteer incredible numbers of hours in sharing the passion by shaping consistency and uniformity in the marketplace by working with the manufacturer. The money consumed by National helps modelers do library research, maintain a photograph collection of historical importance, costs associated with outreach, production of a magazine for the modeler, publishing of books with high interest potential to the modeler, and providing a National Convention which is "glue" to helping modelers meet and become friends from across the country.
