# WHEN & WHERE WE MEET





My layout construction has progressed to adding backdrops to the table structure. So why bother with a backdrop?

The most important reason to add a backdrop is to increase the size of your layout. Huh? No, you don't make the table structure larger. The simple act of placing a backdrop to act as a view block from one side of your layout to the other dramatically increases the "mental" size of your layout.

Imagine you have an "L" shaped table 4' wide  $\times$  20' long in one direction and 4'  $\times$  10' long on the short side. You place track running along the sides with turns at each end for a continuous loop. You have approximately 60' of mainline track. Sounds like a lot. Now go stand at one end of the layout. You can operate a train from any one position and always see your train without ever moving.

Now imagine you have placed a 36" high backdrop down the middle of the two legs of your layout. With the the backdrop blocking the view of your train you now have to walk around the layout to see the different areas your train traverses.

You have increased the "mental" length of your layout by at least double to triple its real length. I also believe it makes viewing the individual scenes on your railroad more realistic.

There are different methods for adding backdrops. On

my last railroad I made a frame down the peninsula and covered both sides of the the frame with 1/8" tempered hardboard. I then curved the corners where it met the wall using the back side of vinyl sheet flooring material as well as the corners of the walls. I used spackling to blend the edge of the vinyl onto the the tempered hardboard and the drywalled walls.

I attach my lighting fixtures to the backside of my

valance. My backdrops extend from the table to the ceiling. I prefer this so when standing on one side you cannot see the light fixtures lighting the other side of the peninsula.

The backdrop and walls are painted "sky blue" and then have custom painted clouds hand painted by my crew's master artist, Gary Dunn. (Thank you Gary!!)





I have modified this backdrop design on my current layout by using .060 x 4' x 8' HDPE plastic sheets. I bought mine at Menards

under the brand PLAS-TEX® White Plastic Interior Wall Panel, Model Number: PTC0045M Menards® SKU: 5072787 for \$19.98 per sheet. This material can be cut with scissors or a utility kniker and is very flexible allowing it to be curved where needed, such as corners, to very tight radii.

## GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

#### NMRA MCR Division 4 General Meeting Minutes 10 January 2020 Church of the Redeemer, Westlake, Ohio

Superintendent Lee Sheffield called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm and requested any corrections or changes to the Minutes of the November 2019 meeting. Hearing none, Lee declared the Minutes for that meeting to be official.

Treasurer Greg Noeth gave a brief statement concerning the Division's finances.

Membership Chair George Keller asked visitors and new members to introduce themselves. It was noted that members of the Lorain County Model Railroad Association were in attendance as a group.

Clinic Chair Larry Madson said that Steve Holtzheimer would be the evening's clinic presenter, giving a clinic on modeling a portion of the Akron, Canton & Youngstown Railroad. The February meeting is Member Appreciation Night with pizza, and Larry will be showing videos. Bruce Brintnall MMR and Frank Bongiovanni will be the March clinicians with their Master Model Railroader and the Apprentice presentation. Larry reminded everyone that he is scheduled to step down as Clinic Chair as of the June meeting and the Division is seeking someone to take his place.

Lee said that a Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday February 11 at 7 pm at the Church of the Redeemer. All members are welcome to attend. The next General Meeting will be Friday February 14.

Chuck Klein discussed upcoming elections, stating that all incumbents with the exception of Secretary are eligible to run for their offices, and all have chosen to do so. Chuck encouraged other members to consider running as well. Chuck called for candidates for the position of Secretary as the current Secretary has reached his four-year term limit. [Secretary's note: a candidate did step forward after the business meeting.]

Chuck Shick has volunteered to be the next newsletter editor when Bruce Bowie completes the current season in June.

Upcoming events, including participating at the National Train Show in St. Louis this July, were discussed.

Adam continued, in his role as Raffle Chair, giving a description of the evening's raffle prizes.

The Flatwheel deadline is January 26.

Contest Chair Joe Filipiak talked about the evening's theme of automobile carriers and encouraged

everyone to vote. Winners of the November contest were invited to describe their entries and techniques. Next month's contest will be railroad towers.

It was announced that we have received letters of thanks from the Erie Metro Live Steamers and St Ignatius Modeling Club for recent grants. Joe Filipiak also gave thanks on behalf of the Grafton Rail Projects for a grant received and gave a brief explanation of how the funds were being used.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm.


#### **Davies Steel hopper cars are still available!**

**VALLEYO PAINT & OTHER SCENERY ITEMS** - On a recent trip to Depot Trains I came across a new line of Vallejo weathering colors. These are acrylic paints. The colors are named to compliment items that you are weathering. Engines, the environment or muds. These can be applied with a brush. I would think you could also airbrush the colors but have not tried that.

I picked up bottles of light brown mud, brown mud, rust texture, streaking grime, petrol spills, fuel stains and oil stains. There are several other colors and found the ones I purchased to be interesting. They sell for \$5.99 each.




I also found a new display from Woodland Scenic. There are several new styles of self sticking bushes and "weeds" and trees with leafs that can be pulled apart. I am very pleased with these new products.

Need weights to hold down items when gluing? One of the guys at the New York Central Historical Society gets a small bag of garden stones from a garden supply or home improvement store. He uses plastic bottles. The type that tea comes in. These are individual serving size with a larger mouth opening. I feel any plastic (cottage cheese, butter) container could be used. The small stones are placed into the container. These make excellent weights to hold down almost anything. Homosote, cork roadbed, foam or flex track that has been glued down.

Need more weight? Use a quart milk bottle. Once your gluing project is over, the stones can be placed in your flower bed. - *Joe Kurilec, MMR*®


FYI - Per the National and Regional contest rules,:



I noticed this shop as I drove to the Cuyahoga Valley & West Shore model railroad club. Dolls and Minis is located on Columbia Road, a few feet from the NS tracks. While not a regular hobby shop the store does have a lot of items that model railroaders can use. When you stop at Dolls and Minis make sure you take time to look at all of the products they have.

Dawn, the owner is VERY helpful and also is trying to get younger modelers interested!

Walking a few feet to the right of Dolls and Minis give you a great place to watch trains!






The shop has a very good supply of wood, strip wood and some wood shapes. Paint supplies are also available.





Located at the front of the model is the name plates.


