#### WHEN & WHERE WE MEET





#### BOD MEETING MINUTES

NMRA MCR Division 4 BOD Meeting Tuesday 11 Feb 2020

Church of the Redeemer, Westlake Ohio

In Attendance: Lee Sheffield, Ron Morgan, Greg Noeth, Dave Williams, Joe Kurilec MMR<sup>®</sup>, Adam Woodie, Steve Kaplan, Gary Schaefer, George Keller, Chuck Klein, Joe Filipiak, Bruce Bowie, Joe Mehalic, Ben Lanza, Fred Obreza, Fred Wagner, Frank Bongiovanni, Brian Haas, Chris Shick, Chuck Shick, Larry Kuczynski.

Superintendent Lee Sheffield called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Joe Filipiak reported that his search for a new Division meeting location had resulted in a tentative verbal agreement with the Westlake Recreation Center. Joe stated that our reason for looking for a new location concerned our recent attendance, which tends to overwhelm the church's meeting hall. The room available to us at the Recreation Center is one-and-a-half to two times the size of our current hall. A separate room will be available for non-rail attendees (generally meaning members' wives), and that vendors would have adequate space to set up tables in the main room. We would be permitted to bring in our own food. Parking is close to the building and deemed to be sufficient. The building is located approximately three and one-half miles further west from our current location. The cost would be higher than our current rent. Gary Schaefer made a motion that we enter into a contract agreement with the Westlake Recreation Center for the use of the rooms to begin in September 2020. The motion was seconded by Greg Noeth. After discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

Election Teller Chuck Klein reviewed the Division's election procedures. All elected positions are open for this year's election, with all incumbents currently running unopposed. The exception being the position of Secretary, as Dave Williams has reached the end of his second term and must step down. Chuck stated that Chris Schick has volunteered for the position. Chuck said that additional candidates could be chosen by nomination or petition during the upcoming General Meeting. If no additional candidates are identified at that time, Chuck will call for acceptance by acclamation by the membership during the meeting, and ballots would not be required. It was agreed that Chuck would call for nominations and petitions early in the business meeting to allow adequate time for additional candidates to obtain signatures. Ballots, if necessary, will be sent to the membership for March voting.

Dave Williams noted that he had found what he believed were issues in the Division's Bylaws. It was stated by several of those present that the latest set of revisions to the Bylaws had not been finalized. Lee called for those possessing the latest version to forward a copy to him as soon as possible for review and determination of the steps required to produce a completed version for general membership review and approval. Issues indicated by Dave will be addressed during the review process.

Larry Kuczynski reported that the Division's picnic will be August 8, 2020 at the NEOLS facility.

Meeting adjourned at 8:14 pm.

Superintendent Lee Sheffield called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm and called for any corrections or additions to the January General Meeting Minutes. Hearing none, Lee declared those Minutes as officially accepted.

Treasurer Greg Noeth gave a report of the Division's financial condition.

Election Teller Chuck Klein gave the slate of current candidates and informed the membership that additional candidates could be added by either nomination or petition by the membership. Chuck asked the membership if any additional candidates would be identified through those means. On hearing of none, Chuck called the call for candidates to be closed. He then recommended that since there was one candidate for each position that they be declared elected by acclamation. Steve Kaplan made a motion to accept the election by acclamation and Don Golden seconded. The motion passed by verbal vote, with no opposing votes.

Membership Chair George Keller asked the evening's visitors and new members to identify themselves. George said that volunteers would be needed at the upcoming Railfest to staff the membership tables on both days. Name tags are being reorganized, with the "new member" green name tags being retired to the standard white. Officer name tags will remain yellow.

Clinic Chair Larry Madson said that he would be showing the Buster Keaton movie The General in lieu of a clinic due to it being Member Appreciation Night with pizza. Next month's clinic will be by Bruce Brintnall MMR<sup>®</sup> and Frank Bongiovanni, and the April clinic will be by Bram Bailey. Larry is looking for volunteers and suggestions for clinics after that point.

Lee gave a review of the February 11, 2020 BOD meeting. He informed the membership that we would be moving to the Westlake Recreation Center as of the September 2020 meeting. He gave a description of the facility, with questions being answered. Lee also stated that, based on the BOD meeting, the Bylaws were being reviewed. The picnic will be on August 8th at NEOLS.

Lee said that our normal after meeting location, Baker's Square, had permanently closed, with no suitable replacement identified yet.

Modular Group Chair Adam Woodie spoke about upcoming events for the group, including Medina tomorrow, Railfest, the Avon Lake Library, and the National Train Show.

Flatwheel deadline is February 26.

Layout Chair Ron Morgan said that Division layout tours would take place on May 17th and 23rd. The business meeting was adjourned at 8:06 pm.


#### Davies Steel hopper cars are still available!



So far Chuck Cline, Larry Kowicki in Parma and Joe Filipiak in Grafton have volunteered.





## TURBINE POWER REVIEW

Author Walter Simpson has done a great job of researching several railroads search to keep coal as a fuel to supply steam powered locomotives. He also looks at gas and oil fired turbines.

The soft cover book has many color and black & white images, along with detailed drawings. There is a chapter on the use of atomic power. " What could possibly go wrong?! ". This is VERY good reading.

I learned that there was a oil-fired gas turbine tested on the C&NW in 1952. Its name was the Blue Goose! The only Blue Goose I knew of was a steam engine on the Santa Fe.

The turbine loco was built by Baldwin-Westinghouse.

Don Wetzel's NYC M-497 Jet car also shares a chapter. Unfortunately Don passed and never saw the book.

Normally I would not be interested in a book on this subject. Boy did I learn something here!





#### Here is something I have found very useful in modeling work.

#### NON-MARRING CLAMPS F DELICATE WORK



1. Get a wooden spring clothespin.



2. Take it apart



3. Flip the two halves over back to back.


4. Clamp them together tightly.






5. Drill or file out the notches where the spring arms were previously located.

See the arrows on the previous photo.



6. Re-assemble the "clamp" as shown and file or sand out clearance angles as shown by the arrows. I use a small belt sander for this step but it can be done before the "clamp" is re-assembled.

The spring arms are now where the spring body used to be.



7. Finished "clamp" ready for use complete with Mr. Cheerio's thumb and forefinger.

# COLLISION OF PENN CENTRAL FREIGHT OV-8

The collision took place on former tracks of the New York Central at the mouth of the Cuyahoga River. In 1968 the New York Central and the Pennsylvania Railroad merged to form Penn Central.

On May 8, 1974 train number OV-8, while traveling eastbound was contacted by the drawbridge operator. OV-8 was told the route was clear. OV-8 was traveling 33 miles per hour. This was the old mainline of the New York Central and was controlled with automatic block signals. The drawbridge operator then remembered that a boat was waiting for the bridge to be lifted. He opened the bridge and did not contact the crew of OV-8!

The drawbridge interlocking home signal was 600 feet from the bridge and was red!

OV-8 smashed into the counterweight of the bridge killing the lead engine's crew.



The frame of the lead engine can be seen to the right of the counterweight.



The massive counterweight can be seen behind crews working to remove locomotive components. Notice the fans on the top of the unit, top center.



The force from impact hitting the bridge is seen in this image of the second unit.



Auto frames were spilled on to the tracks from boxcars that were torn apart. Bulldozers were used to push cars off of the track to get the mainlines open as soon as possible. I have been told that crew in the caboose did not know about the crash as the cars in front of the caboose absorbed much of the impact. They thought the OV-8 had come to a stop!
