



EDITORIAL

Have you ever forgot to throw your track switch back, and caused a derailment and possibly a short on the track. How about when you have a track switch on the upper level that you can't see which way the switch is thrown, or the switch is on the other side of the room making impossible to see?

Well adding signals along the track add more "life" and realism to your layout, and make it easier to see the status of your track switches. The simple way is to wire LEDs in series with your switch motors. Just wire a Red one with the polarity in one direction, and a Green one with the opposite polarity together.



There are many other ways to do signals. You can wire the LEDs or Light Bulbs through the Switch Motor contacts. If you use LEDs for this method, don't forget the Resistor.

You can have an automatic method to throw the switch anytime a train is heading toward a switch that is set the wrong way. There are many ways to do this too. I think the easiest way is to use the NCE Mini Panel. This circuit card has 30 inputs, NCE jacks to connect the NCE Control Signal to, and a separate Jack to plug your controller into for programming, and memory to write the programs. The inputs can be wired to Block Detectors or Reed Switched, or even Photo Transistors to detect when a train is coming to a track switch. Use which ever you like. The programming is very simple. You just select menu items on your NCE controller. To program, you plug your NCE Controller into the program Jack, and turn on your power. You put in the Switch Motor Address, then which way you want the Switch thrown (Normal or Reversed). It then moved to the second input, and you program it the same way.

If you use an inputs for each track that comes into a switch against the frog, that means you have enough for 15 track switches. By using this panel in this way, you will never derail your train by forgetting to throw the switch. It will do it for you.

If you use JMRI on your computer to control or display the location of you trains, then the NCE Mini Panel is a great way to keep everything I synch. If you have a manual switch panel to control your track switches, you can wire the switches to the Mini Panel and tell it to throw the switch. That way, the JMRI knows even when you switch your tracks manually.

The NCE Mini Panel can do many things only limited to your imagination. This list price for the NCE Mini Panel is \$59.99, however you can find it for less at train shows, or online.

Speaking of meetings, we are set to have the September 11th meeting at our new location, the Westlake Community Center. The room is big enough to accommodate 80 people spaced apart per the guidelines. All participants will be required to wear a mask and practice proper social distancing. As this is our first meeting at the Westlake Community Center, I expect some hiccups along the way. We are planning on having everything in place such as refreshments, raffle, contest etc. There will tables in the main room if you have something to show or sell. We will have a member at the church just in case someone forgets and shows up there. It is approximately 3.4 miles West from the church to the Community Center via Center Ridge Road. We are looking into videoing the meeting and providing a live feed to Facebook or uploading it to our You Tube page. The bugs will have to be worked out during the next couple of meetings. Other possibilities include Zoom or other virtual meeting programs. Please bear with us as we explore these new horizons. Other Divisions have been very successful conducting their meetings via Zoom. The clinician doesn't have to be at the meeting to present his or her clinic. This opens up the availability of a lot of interesting subjects for clinics.

We will have awards for the top point winners in both the model as well as the diorama categories. The last three contests that were to be held have now become the subjects of our first three contests beginning with a flat car load for the September contest. October's contest subject is a passenger car that was or is a sleeper/bedroom car. Any road, any era, from the earliest heavy weights to todays Amtrak. The contest for November is a rubber wheeled railroad vehicle. The January challenge for you is to build a building that would be found in the business district of a town or city that would be no more than one block from the tracks. The contest for February is large motive power (non steam). No little yard switchers or four axle road switchers. The March contest will be an R.P.O. car. Maybe an R.P.O. car should have been the November subject. Think about it, you'll get it. April's contest is to be a small, rural country railroad station. We will finish the contest session off with May's subject being a box car lettered for a short line railroad that really did exist or still is active today.

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
