

The module group is busy with two events as last year. The international Trees and Trains setup opens on the 28<sup>th</sup>. It is being presented as a window display like the days of Higbee's downtown many years ago. When you peer into the windows you will see the train layout with many decorated trees in the background. For our second year we are set up at the Cleveland Zoo Wild Winter Lights. The layout is much bigger this year but the covid situation brings with it a unique twist. We are set up in a pavilion tarped off on three sides. It is good in a sense that we can keep ourselves safely at a distance from the visitors but it brings another condition with it, weather !!! Yes, we are protected from rain or snow but not from the frigid temperatures. The last night I was there the temp was in the low 40's. We have a space heater to help but the wind is not our friend. I never thought I would have to use winter weight lubrication on my locomotives. The zoo has been selling out every night as they only allow 3000 reservations per evening. And they added the option of driving through the display two nights a week. Check out the Metro Parks Zoo website for further information.

When things clear up we each should have a lot to show others. As of this writing we are planning on having a meeting in January. If things change I will keep you posted.

### MODULE GROUP

Greetings Fellow Model Railroaders!

Things have really turned the corner for the module group these past few weeks. Similar to last year, the module group will displaying two layouts this holiday season. We are once again displaying a layout at the Cleveland Metropark Zoo as well as the Black River Landing in Lorain.

First up is the Wild Winter Lights event taking place at the Cleveland Metropark Zoo. The module group has returned to the zoo for a second season with a much larger layout than last year. This year, the layout is located in the Pavala Hut pavilion instead of the Education Center. Set up of the layout took place on Sunday, November 15th and the curtain went up for the first public display on Thursday, November 19th. Attendance was on the lighter side opening night but picked up on Friday and Saturday.

Wild Winter Lights is open for walk throughs Thursday - Sunday until December 20th. After which the event is open for walk through beginning Monday, December 21st and continuing through January 3, 2021 excluding holidays. There is also a drive through option for those that would still like to view the light displays without leaving your vehicle. This option is available on Tuesdays and Wednesdays beginning November 24th and ending on December 16th. It is highly recommended that you purchase tickets in advance as there is a cap on the number of attendees for both options each evening. This event runs from 5:30pm to 9:30pm each night it is open. Please note, the module layout is not part of the drive-thru option.

The module group is still looking for volunteers to assist in operating this layout for this event. If you are interested, please contact me via email and me know your availability. I can be reached at woo3482@hotmail.com. Oh, one last thing regarding this layout. Dress warm!

Second up is the Trees and Trains event located at the Black River Landing in downtown Lorain. This will the module groups 6th consecutive year of displaying at this event. Unlike years past, the facility will not be open to the public due to COVID. However, the organizers of the event decided to modify this event by creating a display similar to the old Higbee's holiday window display just like in the movie A Christmas Story. With that in mind, the layout will facing the windows so that visitors can view it along with trees from outside the facility.

This event begins on Saturday, November 28th and will be open every Friday and Saturday beginning at 5:00pm and every Sunday beginning at 3:00pm. The event will end on Sunday, December 27th.

As you can see, the module group has gone from an empty schedule over the past seven months to a resource stretching November and December. The trailing truck and other parts of 2100 have been repainted. Here the side rods for the drivers are stored on a pallet.








# SOME VIEWS ON A NEW YORK CENTRAL BUSINESS CAR.




