



#### THE B&O WEST 3<sup>rd</sup> ROUND HOUSE—Part 1 By Joe Kurilec, MMR

#### THE B&O WEST 3<sup>rd</sup> ROUND HOUSE, CLEVELAND, OHIO FOLLOWING THE LINE WEST OUT OF THE FLATS.

#### PART 1

I have always been interested in the B&O West Third Round house in the Cleveland, Ohio flats. As I started to prepare this article, many areas along the B&O became more interesting and required more research. I am sure there are some errors or information that could not be located. One very

important item missing is dates of some images.

#### A BRIEF HISTORY


The Cleveland Terminal and Valley Railway, was founded 1871. It was not until 1880 that some of the line opened. The line was completed in 1884. In 1890 the B&O had controlling interest in the Valley Railroad. In 1895 the CT&V railroad went bankrupt. In 1909 the B&O took over CT&V and merged the CT&V into the B&O in 1915.

Cleveland Lorain and Wheeling railroad, now a subdivision of CSX started out as The Lake Shore and Tuscarawas Valley Railway chartered in 1870. A line was built from Berea, Ohio that connected with the Pittsburgh Cincinnati Chicago and St. Louis Railroad. In 1872 a branch line to Elyria, Ohio was purchased. The Elyria and Black River Railroad. This would complete the line from Berea, Ohio to Uhrichsville, Ohio. This was completed in 1873. In 1874 the LS&TV RR could not pay its mortgage and was sold to a Cleveland investment group, which formed the Cleveland Tuscarawas Valley and Wheeling Railway. In 1883 the CTV&W also failed and was sold and became the Cleveland Lorain and Wheeling Railway. At this time the B&O also had financial problems. In 1901 the B&O came out of bankruptcy. By 1908 the B&O made the CL&W a subsidiary. In 1963 the CL&W was still part of the B&O. During the 1950s and 1960s the Pennsy and the NYC were trying to take control of the B&O. The C&O started to buy B&O preferred stock in the 1960s. In 1962 the Pennsy and NYC agreed to merge letting the C&O become sole ownership of the B&O. This was in 1963. In 1973 the Chessie System holding company came in to being, letting the B&O operate as a separate company until 1986. At this time the CL&W became a subdivision of CSX.


Following is a general outline of what I hope to convey to readers.

**Part one** will start from the B&O Round house at West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, Clark Avenue Yards, Cleveland,Ohio. I hope to show many interesting structures with added information. I hope this article will be enjoyed as much as I have putting it together. All images by Joe Kurilec unless noted.



#### Plat map, Emil Orenick

The Clark Avenue Roundhouse is almost in the center of this 1912 Plat map book. From the left are the Cleveland, Lorain and Wheeling main tracks. Next are the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad Clark Avenue Yards. The B&O acquired the CTV and the CL&W around 1900, and was in control of both roads by 1905. To the right of the roundhouse are the Newburgh & South Shore Railroad tracks, followed by the Wheeling & Lake Erie yard tracks.


To the far right are the Corrigan, McKinney & Company steel mill, which became Republic Steel and then LTV Steel and is now ArcelorMittle. I could not locate a date for this image of the Seneca yards. The B&O Roundhouse and Clark Avenue Yards are at top left. Steel mills have been on this site since 1913. I am guessing that this photo was taken from the old Clark Ave. bridge.

This view taken from the roof of the Clark Avenue Yards Roundhouse. It shows the machine shop, powerhouse stack and water towers to the right. Only the middle building to the right of the Roundhouse roof is still standing. Today it's used as a machine shop for the Midwest Railroad Preservation Society.

#### THE B&O WEST 3<sup>rd</sup> ROUND HOUSE—Part 1



This 2018 image of the middle section of the machine shop is still standing. A lot of the Midwest Railroad Preservation Society large machinery is in this building. Going into this old roundhouse is taking a step back in time. A 1948 building plan shows there was once a lunch and rest building located where the concrete patch is in front of the machine shop.



Walking back from the 2018 machine shop view to West third Street we see the over all view of the roundhouse. At one time this was a very busy roundhouse.




Walking back onto the roundhouse property, to the right of the machine shop is a very interesting, stand alone building. This was used as a storage building. Inside is a second floor that is open and looks down to the lower floor. Less then 50 years ago there was still a flue rack in front of the steps! Ron Spiga added "the building held many parts for all types of repairs in 1967 when working for the B&O". Notice the steam loco tire being used as a railing.




Looking at the back of the storage house, the roundhouse is to the right. Notice the "second story" roof. The 1927 building layout plans call this a 1½-story storage house.

### THE B&O WEST 3<sup>rd</sup> ROUND HOUSE—Part 1




The interior of the storage house is very strange as the upstairs has an open floor looking down to the first floor. One reason for this may be lighting. The roundhouse was in service in 1905 and might be a similar reason early train stations had high ceilings and tall windows. Natural lighting.





This view of the storage building is looking toward the rear of the roundhouse. Notice the "smooth looking walkway" at the lower left center of the image. This was the old narrow gauge track roadbed for moving items around the shops.




Before moving into the roundhouse, I noticed this sign from the old B&O freight station once located on Columbus Road near the B&O station and old train shed.

This detailed building layout shows much of the buildings in 1927. Notice the narrow gauge track between the machine shop and the storehouse building. There was also a ramp for coal loads to the powerhouse, lower right of the building. You'll notice many other support buildings in this view.

In 1948, B&O MOW crews erected a new steel storage building. This building stood in front of the  $1\frac{1}{2}$  story brick storage building. It was built in two and a half months. Notice the lunch and rest room to the left of the roundhouse. Image D shows the 2018 view where the lunch room once stood .

### WE NEED YOUR HELP







