## **CONTEST TABLE**

The new list of contest challenges for 2021 - 2022 season are as follows;

**September** asks for an interesting tank car from the era that you are modeling or simply a tank car that you find interesting.

**October** contest is looking for a small steam powered switch engine. The type you would find in freight yards or industries but not on the head end of a fast freight on the main line.

**November**'s contest subject matter is about something that all railroads have and still do use for traction. Sand facilities are always found around engine service areas, whether it's old time steam or todays diesels. Getting traction on slippery rails is made possible with sand. So let's see what you come up with as a sanding facility.

**January** will give you a chance to build a small, rural station. Depending on the railroad and its location, the designs can be unique and varied.

February's contest is asking for an R.P.O. (railroad post office) car.

**March** is the "blank box car contest. Blank box car bodies will be available at all meetings at the Contest Table. You can have as many as you need at no cost to complete your model project.

**April'**s contest is a grain hauling car. Forty foot box cars were the standard until covered hoppers came along.

**May's** contest is challenging you to show a piece of logging industry equipment that needs rail to move on, other than a locomotive.





The mud/dirt area looked very good. We were told that the color dried in different shades. Nice.




This was a junior entry. This modeler used a "Zoom" contact to the judges cell phone! VERY creative. He also scratch built the stone bridge, left center.

As mentioned in the last issue of the Flatwheel "teaser" here is the complete story of the two sharecroppers as they learn "the greatest hobby in the world". MODEL RAILROADING!

A brief note about Bernie Klein. He worked for Cleveland Transit System and part time at Hobbyville at West 110 & Lorain Road. There he worked with Gary Sole. Bernie helped Gary get into model railroading. Many of you know about "Bernie's Bargains" at our Great Berea Train Show. Chuck & Mike Klein & Gary Sole run "Bernie's Bargains". Just a little part of Division 4 history.

Our story will start off in 1941 when Bernie & Lillian Klein started model railroading. Every year they set up a Christmas layout under their tree.



Take a look at some of the classic Lionel trains. The person to the right (leg & sock) is Bernie's cousin Ernie.



Fast forward to 1948. Another Christmas tree layout, only now it is expanding! Bernie started scratch building structures

for the layout! Notice the water tower left of the tree and to the right, a wooden trestle. More on these great models later on.




Here we see the kids in 1953. You'll notice the younger and much better looking brother, Mike Klein on the left!

Chuck Klein on the right hey you wanna play trains look?" Once again the layout is growing. The wooden

trestle in the rear has expanded and a new wooden fence protects the layout. Mike on the left still has to figure out the wheels of the loco go on the tracks!



This 1955 scene shows the layout growing. The mountains are crumbled brown paper.



It now 1960 and color film is used. Notice to the rear is a HO scale set expanding the layout once again.

In 1963 the village is growing. Beside cardboard structures, the use of Plasticville structures can be seen. The layout has added S gauge American Flyer models just to the left of the village houses.



1965 show more and more items added to the Christmas layout.



In 1968 Bernie painted the Alco diesels in NYC colors. (great job). I think they were originally in Union Pacific colors.

Notice the red stripe at the bottom of the locos. The original Lionel paint job was UP yellow & red.



Here we see in 1978 a standard gauge scale and to the right a Lionel set. The water tower in the center is made from an old Quaker Oats box.

This must have been were Dave Lawler (Mr. Cheerio box) got his start!

Mike Klein still has the water tower model his dad built.



In 1985 the layout started to shrink. I really like the Lionel loco and passenger cars. The use of a Lionel ZW transformer powers the layout,
