

November 12th.




Part 5 left us viewing the new Harvard Dennison bridge from Harvard Ave. Moving ahead just under the new Harvard Dennison bridge as seen below, taken in the 1980s. The lower view was taken in 2018. The top view was from the cab of a Chessie engine moving towards the Clark Avenue yards. (Photo, Ron Spiga) In both of these images much of the track has been removed. The insert shows an opposite view of the tower, taken in the 1960's (Photo, Mike Cole) I found the insert image interesting as it does not seem to show the Harvard-Denison. I am guessing that the old bridge was removed as a new bridge was built in the 1970's or the old bridge was behind the photographer.



Moving left in we are standing on the old W&LE (NS) tracks. The tower once stood in the area of the block signals just left of the bridge supports. The tracks crossing the old W&LE are B&O tracks that go on to Akron, Ohio. The tracks out of sight of this image are the CL&W tracks that head out to Strongsville, Ohio and out to Lester, Ohio. The Harvard Denison Avenue Bridge is above.




Looking down from the Harvard Denison Bridge in this 2019 image, the left set of tracks that curve are the B&O now CSX. The tracks on the right belong to the W&LE, now NS tracks.




Back on the ground, turning 180°, around West 14<sup>th</sup> Street, the CL&W (B&O) is on the left. The tracks at left are the W&LE (NS). Both railroads will parallel and separate just past Brookside Park (The Cleveland Zoo) Where I-71 now is.




This Google map shows, top right, the area of Jennings & Harvard Roads were the B&O & W&LE cross. The bottom right arrow shows the B&O tracks. The arrow to the left shows the W&LE tracks. The arrow box, lower left shows where the B&O South Brooklyn station, Fanner manufacturing and other businesses that were located there. The bridge going over the tracks is route 42 (Pearl Rd.)



This 1912 Plat map shows the area left of Pearl Road (route 42) showing the bridge once called Brooklyn-Brighton Bridge. Below the bridge was the CL&W (B&O) South Brooklyn Station. That area is now part of the Cleveland Zoo parking lot, that is behind the Rain Forest building. At this time the CL&W served the station and the businesses around this area. Top right shows the W&LE tracks that served the Bailey Wall Paper Co.



The 1927 map shows the Fanner Manufacturing Company to the upper left. Notice that the W&LE now crossed over the B&O to serve industry around the South Brooklyn Station. This 1927 map also show a lot of changes to the B&O tracks. The traffic bridge is now named Brooklyn Bridge Viaduct.



I found this 1949 view of the Cleveland, Ohio Zoo at the Brooklyn Historical Society. They were surprised to learn of the B&O station! From left arrow A is the W&LE tracks. B is the Fanner Manufacturing Company. C is the old Brookside Park swimming pool. Arrow D points to the South Brooklyn station. It looks like most of the W&LE tracks seen in the 1927 Plate map view are gone. Fanner Company seems to be busy. Points of interest are lower left, Monkey Island and to the right was the old reptile house. That goes back a long way for me! Image by: Robert Runyan from the collection of Bruce Young. Across from the city is his engine house to the right. The unloading crane area has a lot of detail.




Here are one of the yards on the layout. Notice the tank train in the background and the two levels for train running.





There are several areas of the layout that are modeled after prototype places in Hermosa such as the station above. Ron does an excellent job of modeling these areas.



I saw a VERY helpful idea in one issue. When you put trash bags into a plastic trash it creates a vacuum. Removing the trash bag can be hard.

A quick solution is to take a hole saw around 2" in diameter, drill two holes at the bottom of the trash can on each side. When a trash bag is placed inside, there will be no vacuum!




