

As always, Model Railroading is Fun!!!








We left part 6 showing the old Cleveland Zoo. Below, looking north of the zoo grounds, towards the West 25th Street bridge (Pearl Rd.) The station is located to the right. To the right of the station are steps leading up to Pearl Rd.


To the left of the B&O tracks are the W&LE tracks that parallel the B&O. Notice there is a spur from the W&LE tracks crossing the B&O tracks to the small yard located right of the station, out of view. Image date 1905.






The top view is the approximate 2019 view of where the station once stood. The lower 2019 view is from the Pearl Rd. Bridge.

The B&O bridge and tracks are lower center. The station was located near the dumpsters, center left.




Looking southwest. This station larger then the 1905 station and is a different design. . Notice to the right of the station are the tracks serving the W&LE and the B&O tracks leading to Fanner Manufacturing Company. Notice the outhouse to the left of the station. PLANT OF THE FANNER MANUFACTURING CO.

I found this artwork at the Brooklyn Historical Society showing the layout of the Fanner plant, organized in 1893. At that time they employed about twenty people, increasing employment to 500! Fanner made light gray iron castings, stove trimmings, nuts, bolts and rods. At one point Fanner had the largest nickel-plating plants in the country.




This image was taken from the Pearl Road Brooklyn Bridge in 2019. The tracks on the right were the W&LE. The tracks on the left are the B&O.

Fanner Manufacturing company would have been center, far left, now the Zoo parking lot.

In the distance is the Fulton Road bridge going over the Zoo.

Part 8 will go over some of the businesses in this area and on to the Fulton Road bridge as we follow the B&O.



Looking south in the 2019 image is the zoo parking lot where Fanner Manufacturing Company was located.
