



#### THE B&O WEST 3rd ROUND HOUSE FOLLOWING THE LINE WEST OUT OF THE FLATS PART 9


We left part 8 @ the CSX diamonds near Brookpark Road. We will cross Brookpark Road and take a look at the Parma yards.



The yards are located between Brookpark Road and west 130th street to the right of the GM complex.




The GM complex can be seen to the left rear. Still standing is a very old freight ramp. A B&O wagon top box car was parked here for many years as a storage shed. To right center is the yard office.



This photo show the old yard office. Photo, Ron Spiga.




The end of the yard stops at west 130th. Street. In the image below we turn around with our back to the yards.




Looking west from west 130 Th. St. Almost in the center left at the pile of ties was a spur to the power station. I have seen several depressed center flat cars in the 1960s on this spur carrying large transformers. As we move west over Hummel Road, seen in the distance, the tracks pass thru the city of Brookpark. They cross Snow Road, Holand Road and Smith Road ( west 150 Th. St.)



At Smith Road the tracks continue west to Middleburg Hts. The fence at the right was the entrance to the old Smith Road quarries, a place to swim. It is now a housing development. At the far left, paralleling the tracks is Stroud Road.



Stroud road is a dead end street. Almost at the end of the street next to the tracks are footers from the old water tank that once stood here. Photo, Ron Spiga.




As we get back on the B&O tracks, the next road we cross is Fry Road. The remains of an old siding that once served a lumber yard that was on Bagley Road. Bagley road can be seen in the distance upper left. Once crossing Bagley Road, the tracks cross Engle Road on the way to Fowles Road where the B&O station once stood.




Fowles Road B&O station 1919. Fowles road is to the right. Image, Berea Historical Society.



In this view the station is closed, train order signals removed. The spur going right would lead to the Berea quarries and the Berea power plant where coal was delivered by the B&O. Photo taken in 1968. The station was moved to Trolly Land USA on Columbia Road. The station can be viewed today at Clint Williams shopping complex along with other railroad items. It is located on Columbia Road and Bagley Road, near NS tracks that cross Columbia Road. The complex is about a block away from the CV&WS model railroad club. Notice the electric power grid just above the switch stand.



This plat map shows the station location, upper right and the spur (left center) leading to the Berea Light & Water Plant and The Cleveland Stone Company.



The station once stood where this relay box now stands. The spur is gone. To the center where the tracks curve to the right heading to Main Street, where in the next photo the power grid is located.



At Main Street, to the right is the power grid that can be seen is the 1968 image at Fowles Road. The station once stood at the center rear of this image.



Looking west from Main St., the track curves to the left and will go over the trestle over the Metro Parkway.

Part 10 will start from the trestle over the Metro parkway with a stop at the old Berea Brick & Tile company on the way to the Strongsville B&O station.






