







The first layout I visited was Steve Holheimer's N scale layout in Lakewood. I really like the helix that Steve built.






Steve's modeling skills shows in his structures & buildings. This is a very nice job on this building. Very impressive.


Joe is able to squeeze a lot of buildings and add a TON of details to his scenes.
