
be World's Greatest Hobby! This event will take place at the IX Center on Saturday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> from

#### MARCH



#### Modules:

Please let me know if you would like to display at this event. Currently, we have large amount of space allocated for the layout and intend to use the large radius loops. We would like the size of the layout to be similar to that of the Great Berea Train Show.

#### Set Up:

#### 'All aboard!' Regional train group makes stop at Avon Lake Public Library Lauren Hoffman—The Chronicle-Telegram

AVON LAKE — The whir of electronic motors filled the air as lights flashed inside the tiny diner and nearby apartments. A painted bright blue sky and grassy knolls lay in the backdrop as Engine 1682 chugged past.

It's a hobby that Adam Woodie has been doing since he was 6 years old. "We all got our start, I think, around the same time," he laughed. "You're 6 years old, and there's a brand new train set under the Christmas tree; it all went from there."

Woodie is one of over 40 participating group members from the National Model Railroad Association's Mid-central Region Division Four who set up a weekend display at the Avon Lake Public Library.

On Sunday afternoon, the group wrapped it up, but not before Woodie and his group had welcomed over a 100 people into their world of model trains. "We've been coming to the library for quite a few years now, but last year was our first year back since COVID-19," Woodie said. "(Library communications manager) Shea Alltmont reached out to us back in 2021 and wanted us to bring the display back due to popular demand. So here we are."

It was one of the group's biggest displays at the library to date, complete with a full Cleveland-inspired layout plus two circular tracks. On Saturday, visitors were treated to mini-build clinics in addition to the modular railroad layout.

"This group has been great for our library and the public," Alltmont said. "We have had a long-standing relationship with them, and they always put on a really amazing show that is good for everyone from the enthusiast to the casual viewer."

Mini clinics included how to build a model train layout, what it takes to put together a mountainside and how to paint and add details as well as tips and tricks on where to get started.

"There's something for everyone in it," Woodie said. "Some really like the electric aspect, others the painting and some the whole build so it's really neat."

Alltmont said the library is lucky to be able to welcome the group and appreciates the services it provides.

"These gentlemen take time out of their busy schedule to set up here at Avon Lake Public Library, and we are so thankful for it," she said. "It's something that continues to grow and spread joy."

In addition to the display each March, the group also shows at The Great Berea Train Show at the Cuyahoga County fairgrounds in October, the World's Greatest Hobby on Tour show at the IX Center on March 23-24 and the Cleveland Oktoberfest.



## WHAT'S ON THE WORKBENCH By Scott Eastburn

On the Old, Slow & Easy, my On30 Scale Railroad, I have a rule of no Ghost Crews. A Ghost Crew is an empty cab in a locomotive. Most of my locomotives are Bachmann Spectrum On30 Engines. Depending on the locomotive the cabs offer ample space or very limited space. In the Cabs with apple room I use 3d or cast metal O Scale figures. In the Cabs with very little space for a crew I use very inexpensive bulk O Scale figures. I purchase them on Amazon in packs of 50 or 100. These figures are good from far, but far from good so I modify and paint them. I begin by altering them for fit and position in the specific cab. The next step is to fine tune the figure by scribing coveralls and additional details. I then add sculpted on coveralls when appropriate and hats. I sculpt these items out of two part sculpting epoxy. Once the sculpting is complete I paint and weather the figures. I also use this process to create inexpensive figures that operate outside of the Cab. The results are acceptable crew members to bring life to my locomotive fleet.
