The North Coast Limited 2024 Mid-Central Regional Convention May 16 – 19, 2024



The North Coast Limited 2024 Convention will be arriving soon. If you have not already registered, you will want to make sure to register soon and book your hotel room. Your hosts, Division 4, The North Coast Division, have full array of activities you can do during your visit to Northeast Ohio. Some of the Convention highlights include:

AWARDS & RECOGNITION BANQUET

The Convention is capped off on Saturday evening with the Awards & Recognition Banquet. Our Banquet speaker will be Mr. Pete Poremba, Executive Director of the Jerry and Laura Jacobson Foundation, dba Ages of Steam Roundhouse Museum. Pete will be talking about how is interest in model trains growing up lead to an over 40-year career in railroading and to him being named Executive Director of the Foundation to carry on Jerry Jacobson's legacy for Ages of Steam Roundhouse. OPERATING SESSIONS


CLINIC CORNER

There were no diorama entries. Next month is Bag of Parts - Building using all the Parts in the Bag. Next Sessions Contest will be revealed at the May meeting.




Division 6 of the NMRA Mid-Central Region is currently offering a 41' gondola lettered for Buckeye Steel Castings.

Buckeye Steel was a large steel foundry located in Columbus, Ohio. They produced castings of numerous railroad components, including trucks, couplers and, the famous "Buckeye Truck." These gondolas moved scrap as well as finished products. Interchange partners included C&O and NYC, both railroads having trackage leading into the plant complex.

These car kits are from Accurail's 3700-series of steel gondolas with road number 23. Decals for six other road numbers are available for those ordering more than one car.

Pricing is \$27 per car. Shipping (via USPS Priority) is \$10 for one car and \$17 for two to three cars. Ohio residents, please add 7.5% sales tax on the total price of the kits and the shipping/handling fee. Customers outside the USA, please contact us for shipping arrangements and charges.

Kalmbach rail magazines, Trains.com sold to Firecrown Media


WAUKESHA, Wis. — *Trains* Magazine, the company's other rail magazines, and Trains.com are among assets that have been sold by Kalmbach Media to Chattanooga, Tenn.-based Firecrown Media, the two companies have announced today (May 1).

Other Kalmbach titles involved in the transaction are *Classic Trains*, *Model Railroader*, *Classic Toy Trains*, *FineScale Modeler*, and *Astronomy*, as well as Kalmbach's online stores.

The publications involved will continue to be based in Wisconsin.

Firecrown Media owns a wide range of transportation brands including Flying,

Plane & Pilot, Boating, Yachting, and the supply chain site FreightWaves.



Firecrown CEO Craig Fuller said in a press release that "The rail titles fit perfectly into the Firecrown portfolio and the breadth of experience of our staff ... Kalmbach has deep ties in the railroad community, having published magazines and books about railroads and model trains for over 90 years. There isn't a deeper connection in the rail enthusiast community than the one that Kalmbach built. The Firecrown staff will work diligently to continue and build on that connection moving forward.

"Additionally, the rail and aviation communities have a great deal in common. Besides the obvious both being transportation modes and having similarities in business models — the enthusiast audience is vast in both categories. We believe that 'railfans' and 'avgeeks' are kindred spirits. "With the acquisition, Firecrown plans to invest significantly in *Trains*' business editorial coverage, increasing the cadence and depth of coverage of the rail industry. 
KINGPIN EDITOR NEEDED


