

The North Coast Division holds 10 meetings a year (none in July and August). Meetings are on the **2nd Friday of each**





New Meeting Location in 2025



From west: I-480 eastbound – Exit 3 (Stearns Rd.) Left on Stearns Rd. – 0.8 mi. to Lorain Rd. Right on Lorain RD. – 0.5 mi. to West Park Dr. Left on West Park Dr. – 0.2 mi. – Building on right

From east: I-480 westbound – Exit 6B (North Olmsted) Right to north on Great Northern Blvd. – 0.2 mi. to Brookpark Rd. Left on Brookpark Rd. – 0.7 mi. to Lorain Rd. Slight Left on Lorain Rd. – 1.1 mi. to West Park Dr. Right on West Park Dr. – 0.2 mi. – Building on right


